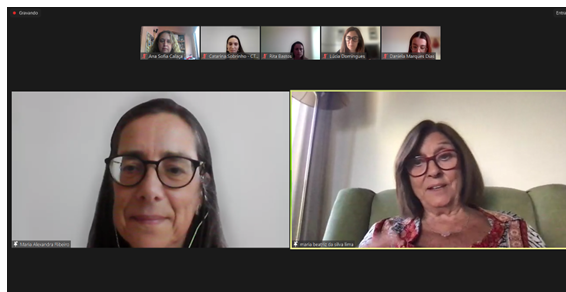
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Workshop on International Regulatory Systems marks the end of the training cycle

The final workshop of the CT Luso training, dedicated to the theme "International Regulatory Systems" took place on June 3rd and marked the closing of Module 6 - Regulatory Affairs, as well as the Training Course, "Ethical and legal principles for the development of scientific and clinical research", which began on December 3rd, 2024.

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10th CT Luso Meeting marks the end of training and reinforces commitment to partner countries

On June 4th, the 10th meeting of the CT Luso project was held, marked by the assessment of the training cycle that, over six months, mobilized professionals from PALOP around key themes on clinical trials and regulation.
