



## CT Luso Webinar: Clinical and Non-Clinical Research

The **second session of the CT Luso Webinar series**, dedicated to the theme "Clinical and Non-Clinical Research: Scientific Methodologies and Professional Integrity. Good Clinical Practices. The Role of Ethics Committees", took place online on January 29th, focusing on the scientific and ethical principles that guide health research.

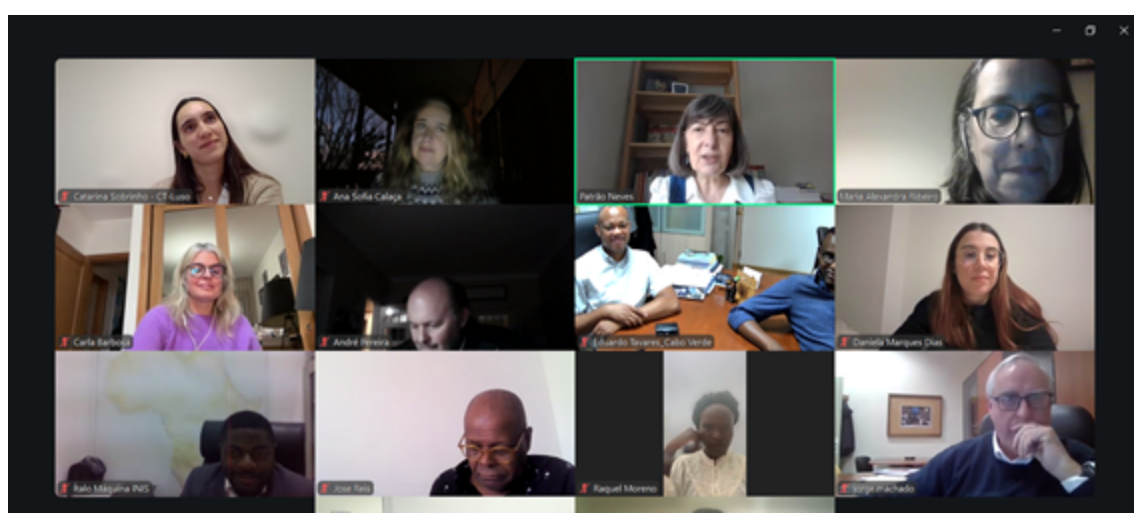
The session was moderated by **Esperança Sevene**, scientific leader of the CT-Luso Project, and included the participation of **Susana Magalhães**, coordinator of the Responsible Conduct in Research Unit at i3S, who highlighted the role of good clinical practices, professional integrity, and ethics committees in promoting rigorous, transparent, and responsible research.

The next webinar is scheduled for **February 26th (6:00 PM in Portugal)** with the theme **"Regulatory Affairs in Africa"**.

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The second level of **Advanced Training dedicated to the ICH-GCP (R3) Good Clinical Practice Guidelines** will begin in February. This phase, lasting approximately four months, is intended for professionals involved in the evaluation, monitoring, and conduct of clinical trials, selected through a joint process with partner countries and under the coordination of CT Luso. With around 140 trainees, the initiative has the collaboration of **Nova Medical School**, **INFARMED**, **CEIC**, and **CNBS**, with a theoretical-practical approach focused on the communication of safety information and the application of ICH-GCP (R3) principles in real-world contexts.

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The **16th meeting of the CT-Luso Project coordination team**, held on January 7th, took place online and brought together representatives from various partner institutions in Portugal and the Portuguese-speaking world to review the progress of ongoing work, with a special focus on legislative recommendations, the communication strategy, the webinar schedule, and activities planned for 2026.

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## CT Luso Video: The Portuguese language at the service of ethics and cooperation.

**Moisés Francisco**, vice-president of the Ethics Committee of INIS, from the Angolan Ministry of Health, underlines in this video the structuring nature of the project, highlighting the progress already achieved in harmonizing procedures between the countries involved in the CT Luso project. Recognizing the importance of a common language, he also advocates for strengthening Portuguese as a language of technical communication, essential for consolidating good practices, promoting cooperation, and ensuring consistency in health ethics.
