



11th meeting: Assessment of the training and preparation of the international Lusophone symposium

The CT Luso coordinators and partners met via videoconference on July 2nd. The 11th meeting highlighted the completion of the training cycle, which included 251 trainees from various Portuguese-speaking countries and achieved results far above expectations: **the average trainee grade was 80%**. The overall evaluation of the training was also rated "very good" or "excellent" by most participants.

The virtual meeting also discussed the organization and dissemination of the **International Lusophone Symposium – "Lusophone Regulatory and Procedural Harmonization for Clinical Trials: Is It Possible?"**, which will be held on September 25th at the Portuguese Pharmacists' Association in Lisbon, with streaming reserved exclusively for Portuguese-speaking countries. CT Luso project presented within the scope of Capacity that brings together partners from Tanzania and Uganda

As part of a project focused on clinical trials in East Africa, **CAPACITY 2023**, the President of the Portuguese Pharmacists' Association, Helder Mota Filipe, presented **CT-Luso** and its predecessor **BERC Luso** on July 4, sharing his experience coordinating capacity-building initiatives in Portuguese-speaking African countries (**PALOP**).

CAPACITY 2023, which brings together partners from **Tanzania** and **Uganda**, held in-person training internships in Lisbon and Coimbra in late June and early July for five professionals from its partner institutions to gain a better understanding of the existing regulatory frameworks for clinical trials and pharmacovigilance at both the national and European levels.
